Her research interests include posthuman digital education, networked learning and the use of social media in language teaching and learning.



Aline Germain-Rutherford, PhD, is Vice-Provost, Academic Affairs, at the University of Ottawa and Professor in the Faculty of Education. She received a Doctorat de Didactologie/ Didactique des Langues et des Cultures at La Sorbonne Nouvelle, Paris III, France and is the author of numerous publications on faculty development, second language pedagogy, speech technology and the integration of sound pedagogy in e-learning practices. She is also the co-editor of the The Routledge Handbook of Plurilingual Language Education. She has been a member of the DOTS, MoreDOTS and ICT-REV team at the European Centre for Modern languages (ECML). She is a recipient of the 3M National Teaching Fellow Award, a Canadian Award that recognizes excellence in teaching and leadership in higher education.
